Information on the erroneous connection between domestic violence and use of alcohol and other drugs will be discussed.

Objectives: At the end of the workshop, the participants will:

- ◆ Participants will be able to identify current myths and facts regarding adult male batterers.
- ◆ Participants will be able to identify a conceptualization of the behavior pattern of adult male batterers.
- ◆ Participants will be able to identify the role that community members can take in ending adult male battering.
- ◆ Participants will be able to identify the relationship between alcohol and other drugs and adult male battering.
